

Message from the Pastor

CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL: This Sunday is Commitment Sunday for our Catholic Services Appeal. Hopefully, you have received a letter from Bishop Persico inviting you to be a part of this Appeal and a pledge envelope. More pledge envelopes are available in the pews. Be on the lookout for the Faith Magazine that will have more information about this year's Appeal.

In my homily last weekend, I outlined how we are using the Catholic Services Appeal to also fund some major projects at the two Churches.

There are three boilers at St. Thomas – Church, School, and Office that desperately need to be replaced. We have been band-aiding them for the past two years and again just a few weeks ago.

At St. Teresa the roofs on the Parish Center need to be replaced, as we have been patching them for the past two years and years prior to that. We have been cleaning up one leak after another on the inside of the building.

These are projects that need to be done now. The future of our Churches is now. We cannot wait. And these projects, as you can imagine, are quite costly.

The boilers at St. Thomas will cost around \$250,000. The roofs at St. Teresa will cost around \$200,000.

We plan to begin these projects this summer, so we are ready for the next winter.

We plan to pay for these projects by adding them to our Catholic Services Appeal over the next three (3) years. That will mean adding a significant goal to our yearly assessment. At **St. Teresa our goal for each of those three years will be \$94,000**—\$27,000 for our CSA assessment and \$67,000 to go towards the roofs. At **St. Thomas our goal each of those three years will be \$123,000**—\$38,000 for our CSA assessment and \$85,000 to replace the boilers.

These projects are crucial for our present and our future. I have seen the good work you have done in the past and I trust that you will see how important these projects are to our present and our future, and that you will support these projects with your gifts to the Catholic Services Appeal over the next three years.

THE WORD AMONG US BOOKLETS: People seem to like these booklets, and we are continuing to purchase them for people from our parish. The Rosary Societies from each church have been underwriting the cost of these booklets. These booklets are intended for individual people of our parish. We hope that you continue to find them as a source of prayer and growth in your relationship with God.

ISSUE: We usually purchase enough booklets for those who want to use them. Recently, we seem to have someone taking large numbers of these booklets from St. Thomas to use at another location. Hence there are not enough for our parishioners who want them. This person needs to purchase the books for their purpose and not take ours. I might remind this person what you are doing is stealing. If the issue persists, we will find other ways to distribute the booklets to our parishioners.

PARISH COUNCIL: So far, I have a few people from St. Thomas who are interviewing for positions on Parish Council and no one from St. Teresa.

The new format for Council is still in the early stages of development. The heart of this new Council will be that they will brainstorm ideas to keep our parish moving forward and building





Lent 2026



ASH WEDNESDAY: Wednesday, February 18, is Ash Wednesday and marks the beginning of Lent. A prayer service with distribution of ashes will be celebrated at 8:00AM at St. Thomas and 7:00PM at St. Teresa. There will also be a prayer service at Noon with the distribution of ashes at both Churches.

PRAYER, FASTING AND ALMSGIVING: and other forms of self-denial are encouraged during Lent. Daily Mass is particularly encouraged.

ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT, AND GOOD FRIDAY: are days of abstinence from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older.

ALL FRIDAYS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR: outside of Lent remain days of penance. Each Friday is an opportunity for us to reflect on the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross made on Good Friday. As part of our gratitude for what God has done for us some act of penance should accompany each Friday of the year. The traditional practice of abstinence from meat, together with fasting, for the cause of peace in the world is highly recommended. However, some other practice of voluntary self-denial or personal penance may be substituted.

ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY: are **DAYS OF FASTING** for those age 18 to 58 inclusive. (Those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal and two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are permitted. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: During the Lenten Season we will celebrate the Stations of the Cross on Thursday evening at 7:00PM at St. Teresa and on Friday evening at 7:30PM at St. Thomas.

LENTEN PENANCE SERVICE: Sunday, March 8 at 1:30pm at St. Teresa Church in Union City. Several priests will be available to hear individual confessions.
